






Family Hog Roast 2017

this month. We celebrated in proper fashion with a magician, sumptuous party food laid on by our lovely pub hosts (though no party jelly and ice cream, I noticed), a welcome to 2 visitors from the Eaton Belles WI, and lots of

laughter.

Housekeeping first: If you are interested in donating to the Hospital Carer's Pack (ref – last month's report) then simply get your stuff over to Meg's and she'll do the rest (thanks Meg) (tip – if they are on BOGOF, it's like you've not even paid for the things); remember the monthly Book Swap; keep a look out for an interesting/puzzling antique item for our May meeting; and save those scarves and handbags for the June meeting.

So on to our speaker. Paul Vickers is a magical entertainer with a difference he did the trick, flummoxing us completely, then told/showed us how it was done. He added in a little bit of history of magic with the patter and so we learnt that magic is one of the oldest professions (yes, along with that other one) being practised in Ancient Egypt; that a book entitled 'The Discoverie of Witchcraft' by Reginald Scott was the first book written disclosing magic's secrets and that it was ordered by King Charles to be burned (one survived - on a ship bound for Spain - was eventually returned and is now at Magic Circle HQ, hands up who'd like to have a read of that!); that the Magic Circle has *never* paid the £1000 reward for solving The Indian Rope Trick (the one where the man charms the rope to stand up straight, the boy shins up

the rope and disappears) and now calls it The Trick That Never Was; and finally that Harry Houdini was one of the best card magicians of his time but wanted to be famous so, on realising that people will watch anything they think is crazy, became an escapologist (though he actually died from a punctured spleen after a punch to the stomach). Wow. Paul made us laugh, gasp and puzzle over ropes which were/weren't cut/ knotted (Ellie took it personally that the rope wouldn't behave for her); showed us how he palms the pea in The 3 Shell Game (it looks effortless and although Paul said it is only practise, it's incredibly difficult); how there are actually 4 balls in the 3 Ball Game (some people nodded sagely when he explained this but I, being on the thick end of the scale, was suitably gobsmacked); card tricks with blank cards, cards surreptitiously pushed under the deck and cards which just pleased themselves so far as I could see; and the word tricks the ones where our minds correct what our eyes see (try this one: write I / love / Paris in the / the springtime in a pyramid with the breaks where I've put the slashes, then ask someone to read it. They'll know the phrase and will miss out the second 'the' because their brain is correcting the fault - clever eh!) Magic is dishonest, distracting tomfoolery and our guest suggested that anyone can do these tricks with enough practise (like driving or typing). I think that that may be so but honestly Paul, we'd sooner watch you do it because the chat was fast and funny and the tricks were effortlessly done. Many thanks to Perry WI's favourite magician.


