



Our book for June was 'The Children Act' by Ian McEwan. The story revolves around a high court judge, Fiona Maye, and one particular case that forces her to make a life or death decision whilst also trying to make sense of the changes in her domestic life. There were lots of things going for the book: it was short (always a benefit when you have a limited time to get it finished!); it was about a woman who was in the same age range as most of us; it was well-written and it reminded us of many cases reported in the press that we have probably all breathed a sigh of relief that we haven't been responsible for the judgement.

Our discussion was lively and drew on a vast wealth of experience (especially from those who are or have been in the medical profession). We also talked about how moral, secular and religious law were different to legal law. There was talk too about love, fidelity, sex and being too liberal with kisses ... as well as guilt. Recently made into a film starring Emma Thompson, it was interesting to hear, from those who had seen the film, about how close to the book the script had kept.

Out Topic for the month was "The History of The Royal Oak at Hail Weston" with Reuben as the guest speaker, who was mainly speaking of the recent changes to the management of the pub. However the discussion was enhanced by not 1 but 2 of the ex-pub's landlords who were able to fill in more details. This made it very difficult to follow the conversation as different people chimed in with added information but was fascinating to hear.

Apparently there were 3 pubs in Hail Weston originally; The Crown, closed 2001, The Snug 1920's and the Royal Oak. The latter a Grade 2 listed thatched building dating approx. 17th C was also used as an auction house, to hold inquests and for rent collection. We were shown pictures of some of the previous tenants, many of whom were women who carried on the role of landlady after the demise of their spouses. Clearly women were very important in the pub's history and hence of the village life!

The current chapter began in 2011 when the Charles Wells Brewery sold the pub to a private individual who wished to develop it as a residential opportunity. A community action group was formed to attempt to buy the Royal Oak and run it as a co-operative community pub. In January 2013 the Royal Oak was registered as an Asset of Community Value under the Localism Act 2011 which prevented it becoming anything other than a public house. 150 folk acquired shares in the building but

unfortunately the group initially failed in their endeavours to buy the pub. Over the next few years various events were held in the village to keep the profile of the pub alive and to remind / rekindle a sense of community. These involved, go kart races, pop up pub sessions in the village hall including curry and fish and chip nights and cask ales.

A second attempt to acquire the building began and eventually a small group of villagers pooled resources to become "The Hail Weston Pub Company" which was finally successful in January 2017. Then followed 3 ½ months of hard work as the group had to renovate the building, which when you see the pictures of a building stuck in the past and stories of carpets, placed on carpets, placed on carpets and no investment was incredible. The village rallied to the call and over 100 individuals and companies participated by giving of time, skills, equipment and resources. The Royal Oak reopened its doors as an independent pub on 19th May 2017. Since then they have worked hard to gain a reputation for good food, friendly atmosphere and welcoming to families, dogs and village life.

Events on the horizon are WestFest, for music buffs 9th /10th August and a film night showing Bohemian Rhapsody on Sunday 25th August.

The next meeting is Tuesday 13th August 7.00 p.m. in the White Hart and the following month is our Harvest supper on Tuesday 10th September. Please feel free to come and see what we get up to as guests are always welcome, and of course being the WI there is normally cake!!

Public urged to stay fire safe this summer

Cambridgeshire residents have been urged to stay fire safe when outdoors over the summer.

The weather so far has not been as warm as forecast earlier in the year. However with high temperatures still to come potentially there is still the risk of fires in open areas of land easily spreading and becoming out of control.

In June and July 2018 crews attended 551 fires in the open across the county, an increase of more than 50 per cent on the previous year. Last July alone saw crews attend 376 fires in the open in various places around the county. This year we believe the high temperatures will continue into August.

The Service's Combined Fire Control has also seen a sharp increase in the amount of emergency calls they have received reporting incidents in Cambridgeshire and Suffolk. Almost 4,000 calls were answered by emergency call handlers in June and July, an increase of 13 per cent from the previous year.

Group Commander Paul Clarke, head of community fire safety at Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service, said: "We want to help ensure that people enjoy the sunny weather while it's here safely.

High temperatures and dry areas of land can be perfect conditions for a fire to spread. Something as simple as not stubbing a cigarette out properly, or using a disposable barbecue on grass, can start a fire that can develop quickly."

There are seven simple steps we urge residents to take to help prevent an outdoor fire:

- Ensure cigarettes are completely out
- Do not throw cigarettes out of car windows onto grass verges or vegetation
- Put disposable barbecues on bricks, do not place directly on grass
- Do not leave glass bottles lying on the ground, the sun's rays reflect through the glass and can start a fire
- When camping, do not leave campfires unattended and make sure it is completely out before you leave it
- Use barbecues on a hard, flat surface, away from grass, shrubs or fencing
- Talk to your children about the dangers of starting a fire.



Minutes of the meeting held on 21 March 2019 – The minutes were agreed as a true record and signed by the Chairman.

Matters arising:

Ditches – WM has had the go ahead from the relevant landowner and so he will try to carry out this work before the harvest.

Timebank – information was circulated at the PA and BJ attended a seminar. He believes that CCC would probably support a grant application and that would mean receiving half the costs of a two-year period. Costs are estimated at £15k per annum but BJ thinks it will be less as this scheme would encompass three much smaller villages. The cost would be £2.5 – 3k for each parish but the grant would cover half of those costs. There was general agreement at the PA and the church are very interested. BJ asked if

there was a commitment to ongoing expenditure and NY agreed it was worth it if the two other villages committed to the scheme. AG believed it was a good idea to help people who are more isolated in the villages. They could get help with shopping, grass cutting etc and would be good for community spirit. It was therefore agreed that the PC was committed to the scheme. We would talk to HW and Perry. Grant submission dates are 1 August and 1 November.

Green Lane potholes – DM will chase CCC.

Broken Fence Beachampstead Road – matter is in progress. DH looking at the most cost-effective option.

Bollards Green Close – JB reported that planters were not a good idea as they are high maintenance and Horticultural Society cannot maintain so we are back to the bollard idea. It tends to be more of a problem in the summer months and cars have been seen speeding in excess of 30mph. Bollards would cost a lot and an LHI bid may not be appropriate and evidence would be required. We could ask Highways to look at this though.

Ridge and Furrow fields – we still await a response from HDC to our enquiry. Email again and cc DT.

Streetlight outside school – the school have agreed to fix this. But JR will chase as it is still not fixed.

Blueline security – people who attended the PA in May were not enthusiastic. It was agreed that this scheme would not be paid for via the Precept as it would be too costly.

Red House Hedge – this is overgrown. NY will talk to the residents.

Highways – Speed Limits in The Town –

LG reported that people are speeding through that stretch of road and ignoring the 40mph limit. We need to slow the traffic down and portable signs could be funded through a LHI bid. Highways need to come out and look at our ideas to see if they are feasible. DM agreed to set out the proposals in an email which we can then send to CCC.

Parking in Beachampstead – this is worse at weekends. AG suggested that the PC remind people about inconsiderate parking. BJ will put a notice in Life and Facebook.

Hedges - Little Thatch – JB reported that these need to be cut back as it is growing over the path. Clerk will write to say the PC will have to contact CCC who will charge the resident if they have to cut the hedge.

Footpath – DM reported that there had been a complaint regarding herbicide being sprayed on the footpath to Perry which runs at the back of the village. WM said this is not allowed on the footpaths and Clerk will write to Mr Brown asking him to comment.

Report from District/County Councillors –

DT - he reported that the Local Plan had been adopted. He has also received a lot of correspondence about the planning application at 69 The Highway. He doesn't believe that this application is going to the planning committee and that there seemed to be a lot of problems with the application. The HDC Portal is now up and running. BJ mentioned that the St Neots office of the district council was closing

and that the PC had objected to this previously. DT said that unfortunately the numbers do not stack up and visitors of 4-7 per hour cannot justify the costs of keeping the office open.

IG has been re-elected to the Highways Committee and he is Vice Chair of the Planning Committee and Pensions Committee. It is the 50th anniversary of Grafham Water on 27 May and a number of activities are planned at an Open Day to celebrate this. We will advertise on village Noticeboards. CCC plan to be Carbon Neutral by 2040.

IG is meeting with the Highways Engineer next week so he will organise for him to visit GS with DM. He can then advise what is practical. We will let IG know our ideas before 23 May. Regarding the Community Heat Scheme discussed at the PA, IG will also ask Sheryl French to attend the CLT AGM in September.



Dear Friends,

I have always appreciated plants, both wild and cultivated, but I have never really taken as much interest in them as I have this year. Suddenly I find myself in charge of two fairly large gardens, and having never previously done more than mow the lawn, they are quite a challenge.

I was motivated to be more observant by walking round the gardens of Little Staughton on Fathers' day, noticing the variety of planting and design. I have also been treated this year to two days out at flower shows, Chelsea and Hampton Court, both of which were inspirational. So, I thought I would take a look at a couple of plants from the Bible. Plants and flowers are mentioned throughout the Bible — from the “apples” of Genesis and the “bitter herbs” of Passover to the New Testament’s “lilies of the field”. I have two Olive trees outside the front door, a very important part of life in Biblical times. Olives were pressed to make oil that was used in cooking, as well as smeared on the skin and hair as part of one’s personal hygiene care. The first reference to the olive in the Bible is in Genesis 8:1: When the dove returned to him in the evening, there in its beak was a freshly plucked olive leaf! Then Noah knew that the water had receded from the earth.

The Garden of Gethsemane, where Jesus went to pray before His crucifixion, was a

grove where olives were grown and harvested and pressed in huge stone mills. When I visited Jerusalem the Garden of Olives was one of the most significant places for me.

This year there are many purple flowers in my garden and so the second plant I thought I would look at is Hyssop. Surprisingly, it is a member of the mint family and is one of the most mentioned plants of the Bible. It is referred to in ten places in the Old Testament, and two in the New Testament. It is an important part of Passover (Exodus 12:22), and was also used in a ceremonial cleansing of the skin (Leviticus 14). Psalm 51:7 says “Cleanse me with hyssop, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow.” (Happily soap is readily available today!)

I hope the weather is favourable this August and if you are not taking a summer holiday away, you are able to enjoy sitting out in your gardens or walking through the wonderful wild meadows we have in our villages.


