

# FEBRUARY BULLETIN FROM CAMBRIDGESHIRE FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE

ON-call firefighters are a vital part of today's fire and rescue service, providing an efficient, effective service that gives emergency cover to more than 90 per cent of the UK. In Cambridgeshire they make up 56 per cent of the workforce. An on-call

firefighter is not based at a fire station but carries a pager and responds to emergency incidents as and when they happen. They receive an annual wage to reflect the time they commit to being available plus additional payments for attending incidents and drill nights (one evening a week for two hours).

On-call firefighters are men and women who may have other jobs and are able to provide evening, daytime or weekend cover. When they are on-call they may be at home, working for themselves or for a nearby company or out in their local community (staying within a five-minute travel time of the fire station) and are generally located in rural communities, small towns and villages.






eminder: bring a book you've enjoyed with postie note telling us why. If someone takes it - fab! If not - take it home again. Once you've read it you can bring it back, not bring it back, charity shop it, give it to a pal or use it to prop up that dodgy leg on the garden table - the choice, as they say, is yours (as is the book). I took a light-hearted rip-off of Pride and Prejudice (a genre on its own these days) and am thoroughly looking forward to it after the odd

sci-fi thing I'm reading at the mo ...

Reminder #2 – WI annual subs are due if (like me) you forgot your cheque book.

Our visitors this month were Ross and Sally from Tesco Community Space and, after an introduction which I think could bare repetition (we tasted and guessed the names of exotic fruits from papaya to persimmon to that one I can't spell), we learnt initially about 'Farm to Fork' - a free 25-school liaison program which Tesco Community Space run to teach Primary children where their food comes from. They have the Explore the Store tour (bakery, freezers and lorries - BIG favourites), and lessons on Healthy Eating (including how to gut a fish), Sustainability (Fairtrade and Rainforest Alliance), Food for Fuel (involving practical lessons with something called ... star jumps?).

And then on to their other Community work. Oh my word! I had no idea that Tesco did so much for their *local* community – even going so far as to have a Community Champion (Ross). His role is to help – whether that is by a straightforward donation or help running an event. This community work runs alongside the 'National Charity Partnership' which we all know about (at present - Diabetes UK and British Heart Foundation) and is locally based. So in the last year there has been a Pink Weekend (incorporated with Race For Life), 80s Weekend (Ross was DJ), Bella's Wish (£1100 was raised), Mark's haircut for a kidney charity (raised £1500) – the list goes on. In the summer they held a BBQ for community charities at Regatta Meadows where Tesco hired the meadow (small charities just can't afford to) and organised it - everyone from a huge tent doing refreshments to one bloke on his bike. Ross spoke to a lady with a table-stall who made £67. He began to commiserate but she said no it was brilliant as she'd met 3 other people with her condition and they'd chatted and swapped numbers. You may have contributed something to the Poppy Fields Shoebox Presents over the Christmas period. Originally the aim was for 10 boxes per store to be given to 286 residents in St Neots' care homes. However, they got enough to fill over 300

boxes and within 2 months had over 16,000 views of the video on Facebook. In the Community Rooms at the store, a free grotto helped out local people struggling before Christmas; there are 2 WI groups who meet there (one have made many Twiddlemuffs – a muff for dementia patients which helps them concentrate as has bells and buttons etc to fiddle with); and much else besides.

Ross and Sally are, justifiably, very proud of all this good work but we were shocked to discover that the only measure of their success from Tesco's point of view is the question on the Feedback form. Where is that, I hear you cry? On the bottom of your receipt there is website to do a Whole Shopping Experience Questionnaire and there is one question on your knowledge of Tesco's community work! Of course we were asked for help – we are the WI after all! On Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> July this year it will be the Fun Day again and if anyone is around to make cakes (obvs) or volunteer to help then that would be just dandy!

And the future? Tesco are trying to get all colleagues to be trained as Dementia Friendly and there is a move towards Autism Friendly stores so there will be various training days (sign language too) for anyone interested – just check the Tesco Facebook page; by 2022 Tesco are trying to run zero-waste stores so if you have a charity who needs food (eg breakfast clubs etc), then please apply (online). Two of our ladies thanked Ross and Sally personally on behalf of Piglets pre-school and Gr Staughton Primary Academy who have had help from Tesco.

And of course there will be more dressing up for Ross and Sally as they continue to amuse us and thank us for our generosity – as it's all down to our *local* community.

#### Life Magazine – Notes from the AGM Held on Thursday 29th December 2016, in the White Hart, Great Staughton

Present: Bob Jewell (Chairman), Helen Glanville (Treasurer), Shaun Prince (Co-Editor), Rob Young (Co-Editor)

Accounts. The Treasurer produced the draft accounts for the year (2016), which showed a slight\_increase in assets of £189.51. We had produced 12 colour covers this year and 1 colour centre. The Collection boxes fund half an edition. The adverts seem to have stabilised. We have managed to run a 44 page 3 times, 48 page 6 times and 52 page 3 times. Both Great Staughton and Perry Parish Councils have donated to the magazine in 2016 and the Committee expressed their gratitude to them.

Bank Account. The money held in the Life Magazine account was £4967.68 which was £189.51 up on last year. We use an HSBC Community account with Bob Jewell, Helen Glanville and Geoff Gilbert as signatories. Copies of all bank statements are available at any time to ensure visibility.

Printing Costs. The new size has stabilised the costs and ensured the future of the magazine. Easiprint was the cheapest in our latest quotes and the price has been held for 2017. It is still efficient and easy for the Editors to use. They also allow us to change the size of the magazine monthly which gives us good flexibility with a varying level of content. Advertising Prices. The cost for a page will remain at £30 for a whole page. Covers to remain same also. The committee are grateful to those loyal advertisers for sticking with the Magazine.

Posting Magazines Out of Area. The cost of posting copies to "out of area" readers will remain at £14.00.

Magazine makeup. We have managed to run a 44 page magazine 3 times, 48 page 6 times and 52 page 3 times. All have had a colour cover and 1 had a colour centre.

Advertisers. The policy, that advertisers who are slow to pay are invoiced twice and/or given two months grace with their advert, but then are removed from the Magazine, was reaffirmed.

Editors Payment. It was agreed to pay the Editors payment for both Rob and Shaun. The editors incur many costs and it was felt that even this token amount will help towards paying for some of it! The amount was agreed to increase to £132.00 and it would be paid by BACS. Rob and Shaun also kindly agreed to continue editing! The rest of the committee thanked them!

Minutes to be Published. It was agreed to continue to publish these minutes on the Village website and within the magazine. The website minutes have been well read and commented on! 40<sup>th</sup> Edition. The 40<sup>th</sup> edition excerpts were well received and many people have commented upon them, especially the similarities with the present issues.

**AOB.** We still have spaces on the cover for advertising. £60 for small and £100 for large for the year.



#### <u>Telecom Times – February 2017</u>



**Telephone**: Do you suffer from nuisance and unwanted calls? Then there is some good news. BT has launched BT Call Protect - a **free service just for BT home phone customers**. Very briefly this new service works as follows:-

The service diverts nuisance calls to a new junk voicemail which you can access by dialling 1572 from your home phone. You can also add numbers to your own personal blacklist which will also send those calls to your junk voicemail. BT continually monitor for the worst nuisance call offenders and once they have identified them, BT will automatically divert them for you. For more detailed information just enter "BT Call Protect" in your web browser or ring 1572.

**Broadband**: If you have a fibre package and could spare a few minutes I would still be extremely grateful if you could run <a href="http://speedtest.btwholesale.com/">http://speedtest.btwholesale.com/</a> and copy & paste the results of the Further Diagnostics into an email and send it to me at the address below. I mentioned before that due to the above average uptake of fibre in Cambridgeshire there was a £6.3M clawback from BT which will be used to help those people in areas that are difficult to reach. In order that the village gets its fair share of these funds I would like to hear from people that are unable to achieve download speeds above the Superfast threshold of 24Mbps.

Even more important is the need to hear from those at the extremities of the village, where I know for a fact, some are only achieving as low as 5Mbps. If you want to maximise the speed your line is capable of then I strongly recommend you visit the following website <a href="http://www.increasebroadbandspeed.co.uk/">http://www.increasebroadbandspeed.co.uk/</a> created by my fellow Broadband Champion for Spaldwick. If you navigate around that website you will find a lot of information regarding fibre broadband, in particular the effects of crosstalk and G.INP on fibre broadband speeds.

If you have any queries regarding the above, or would like help with any aspect of your telecommunications provision, please feel free to contact me and I will help as best I can.
